St. Joseph's School, a Catholic co-educational primary school catering currently for approximately 150 students, both Aboriginal and Non-Aboriginal, from Kindergarten to Year 6, serving the Parish Community of St. Vincent Pallotti. The school provides a caring environment in which the dignity of each person is nurtured through knowledge and understanding of self, respect of cultural heritage and the love of God. The school is located in the North-East town of Kununurra in the East Kimberley region. The school's curriculum endeavours to cater for all students as we encourage tolerance, reconciliation and respect for others. Throughout the school we provide a range of programs, including Reading Recovery, Literacy and Numeracy support. Our Specialist Subjects include Music and Physical Education. We continue to be actively involved in the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Project and are committed educating students in matters concerning our environment. We aim to engage staff and the whole community, working together to create an environment of collaboration and feedback.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE 2016

Student attendance	The overall attendance percentage for students in Kindergarten through to Yr 6 was 72% for the 2016 school year.
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St Joseph's School uses the following procedures to manage non-attendance:

1. Parents are asked to contact the school by phone or email if their child is absent on that day.
2. Parents are requested to send in a written note to acknowledge the days that their child was absent.
3. School bus service to local communities and town families.
4. Aboriginal Teacher Assistants visited homes on a regular basis to encourage attendance.
5. One Staff member spends one day a week visiting local communities to encourage the parent/carers to send their children to school.
6. Breakfast program for children.

7. SMS messages are sent to parents asking for an explanation as to why their child/ren are not at school.
