CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

St Joseph's Primary School is a Catholic co-educational school comprised of approximately 190 students from Kindy to Year 7. Our school is part of the Parish of St Vincent Pallotti. The school is located in the East Kimberley regional town of Kununurra. 2014 saw the end of Year 7 at our school, and as such we had two graduating classes.

As a school we strive to develop the whole person within an environment that encourages tolerance and respect for self and others. We offer, with the support of the Parish, a complete sacramental programme, incorporating the sacraments of Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation.

St Joseph's School provides a caring environment in which the dignity of each person is nurtured through knowledge and understanding of self, respect of cultural heritage and the love of God. Pastoral care strategies are a focus at St Joseph's School. The school's curriculum endeavours to cater for all students as we encourage tolerance, reconciliation and respect for others. We provide a range of programs throughout the school, which include Reading Recovery, Literacy and Numeracy support, Music, Science and Blueearth. Parent and community involvement is valued and encouraged at St Joseph's School.

Integral to the success of our school is the strong working partnership between our Aboriginal Teaching Assistants, Teacher Assistants and the classroom teachers. With many of our students being ESL learners, small group and individual tuition aimed at exploring Literacy and Numeracy in focused sessions that take into account different learning styles are promoted.

Our Kindy students attend school 3 days per week with a total of 18 hours contact time.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Our students attended school on average 72% of the time in 2014 whether students were living in or out of the Community. This figure includes students who were out of the Community and possibly attending other schools and who may be attending Funerals and "Sorry Time".
